














Thankşgiving Day Luncheon






Kentwood's Thanksgiving Luncheon was a delicious way to move into the holiday. Students put their social skills to work by showing their great table manners and conversational skills.



December's riddle-


What is it that was given to you, that still belongs to you, you never lent to anyone, but that is used by all the people you know?


ART-

The Art 6 class created their own still life pictures after viewing artwork by artist Paul Cezanne using cut paper and charcoal.






The 7th and 8th graders learned about abstract artist Joseph Stella and created their own versions of the painting "The Brooklyn Bridge."
