Mr. Davidson, Ms. DeBeyer and Miss Sterbenz are continuing with assessing each student (grades 1-8) for the next few weeks, checking

for current levels of performance in the areas of math computation, problem solving, spelling, writing, reading, and interpreting graphs, maps and data. The assessment we are using is called the Brigance-Inventory of Basic Skills.
